

FY 2010 EAP Global Undergraduate Exchange Program (Global UGRAD program)

Deadline: November 14, 2009

Funded by ECA, the Global UGRAD program provides scholarships for one semester or one academic year of U.S. study in a non-degree program. The goal of the program is to provide a diverse group of eligible students, from non-elite and under-represented groups with a substantive exchange experience at a U.S. college or university.

Global UGRAD program participants must return to their home countries upon completion of the program and may not stay on for degree study in the U.S.

The program does not encourage study in Medicine, Nursing, Veterinary Medicine, Pharmaceutical Studies, Law and TESL, because of limited opportunities for undergraduate coursework.

Eligibility:

- Eligible students must be currently enrolled at least either in the first year or second year of undergraduate study **for Arts and Science students and third and fourth year students for other studies;** and
- Must not be older than 24 years at the time of application (must not be born before 1984)

Requirements:

- Eligible students must take a screening test conducted by the American Center; and
- Must take the official TOEFL test after being nominated.

CHECKLIST FOR COMPLETE APPLICATION DOSSIER:

Before submitting your application to the address on the front page, please be sure you have included all of the following **REQUIRED** components and all items in

the application forms must be filled in. There will be no exceptions for the missing documents and incomplete applications will not be considered.

- Completed, signed Global Undergraduate Exchange Program application form.
- Personal statement in English, 350-500 words, typed.*
- If you have a passport, please submit a copy of the data/photo page.
- Official transcripts for years of university study (with English translations). Please provide grade equivalences to U.S. University grading system. (GPA)*
- Official results of the matriculation exam.*
- Three letters of recommendation from teachers/professors, including one from the candidate's secondary level institution (with English translations).*
- TOEFL®, ITP®, or other standardized English test score report, minimum 450, 500 or higher preferred.
- Two photocopies of passport-size photo.

** All documents should be submitted in plain, A4 sized paper.
